There is a lot of year-end giving to process and it is officially the close of the Trinity Pines fiscal year (January 1 - December 31). This works well in our finances since we usually have less income and expenses during the final month of the calendar year and don't start to receive registrations and reservations until the first of the new year. You helped us finish financially strong. We have been blessed by new and renewed reservations from groups. Trinity Pines is still that GEM to find for some folks as they explore all the group camping facilities in the Heartland of Idaho (Cascade to Riggins).

We will never be without our usual challenges: hiring, dealing with elements of weather, securing supplies, housing requests and a large indoor meeting space for the winter months. When the camp opened in 2000, people may have thought "give us 10 years and we will have the perfect facility." That did not and most likely will not happen. On January 20, the Trinity Pines Board joined together with the Property/Development and Program/Development Committees and staff to project into our future. We like to look in the rearview mirror and see where we have been, but we also enjoy looking out the windshield and see where we are headed. 2023 helped us realize that we have significant investments ahead for replacing major equipment - hot water boilers, HFAC systems and carpet. We have slowly chipped away at replacing roofs on original buildings, along with adding HVAC in sleeping areas and replacing floor coverings in many areas. But, when you host the numbers of guests we do each year, these items all receive increased demand resulting in a shorter lifespan. Now funds that might have been used for future expansion are being redirected into replacement and maintenance costs for what has been purchased in the past. However, in this process we are also learning about new technology that hopefully will make our operation more efficient and result in savings.

If you have been around anyone who has built recently you have heard them say what we are hearing frequently, "That item is back ordered and may take 2-3 months to arrive," or, "We have a labor shortage and we can put you on the list, but not sure how soon we will get to your request," or, "Our business is so good in the valley that we are just not making trips to the mountains for those types of services any longer." While those are not encouraging statements, at the end of the day we know who is in charge of this operation and we trust Him for direction and protection along the way. The Lord has blessed the camp many times through the years and our work to help people transition their lives to the Kingdom is still first and foremost in our mission, goals and values. If man were in charge of our destiny, then we could be in trouble. With God at the helm, we can rest assured there is a path forward if we are obedient and prudent in seeing God's will for Trinity Pines. Thanks for your prayers and your support.
