## A Life Lived for Christian Camping

Charlotte Cammack was a member of the Ontario Nazarene Church. She was born on April 12, 1936, and lived to be 80 years old, passing away on September 30. Nothing about that part of the story is too out of the ordinary.

Charlotte, however, was an only child born into a non-Christian family. Neighbors took her to Sunday School where she learned about the Lord. She was invited to summer youth camp and it was there that she entered into a personal relationship with Jesus. This ignited in Charlotte a passion for children's and camp ministries. Perhaps, you might have had Charlotte Cammack as director of a Girls Camp on the Intermountain District. She held that position for 15 summers. She also served as the Chairman of the Camps Board and directed the district camping program for five years.

Charlotte always camped at Victory Cove. I had been Camps Board chairman pre-Charlotte's stint as chairman and then followed her when she decided to pursue another adventure in life. She and her husband, Ralph, were foster parents for the Oregon Youth Authority and provided a wonderful haven for more than 25 children and young adults.

The unique part of the story was the passion that Charlotte had for Christian camping. She believed that every child **should, could, and would** go to summer camp each summer. I served on the Camps Board with Charlotte for many years and learned to appreciate and value her insight and vision for camping. After the move to Trinity Pines, she often cornered me at District meetings to question me about the transition. Charlotte was a tireless worker with a servant's heart.

Thank the Lord for caring neighbors, a youth summer camp, a Christian husband, and most of all, thank the Lord for placing a heart in Charlotte for every child to experience a week at camp. Well done, good and faithful servant!

## Phase II of Conference Center

The Camp Property/Development Committee has been working to compile information related to the Phase II remodel and expansion of the Conference Center. The plan is to include the following:

- Expansion of the main office adding a small conference room and a more inviting reception area for those visiting the camp to negotiate contracts.
- Re-siding of the Conference Center with a Hardy Board material as well as enclosing the soffits around the balcony and new canopy.
- Provide 3" paving section of approximately 18,000sf including 4" base course material providing drainage to existing catch basin for the main parking lot to assist with winter snow removal.
- Provide sidewalk to new office and in front of canopy.
- Provide HVAC upgrades. The current system is 16 years old and does not include air conditioning. New systems have efficiencies that will save money in the long run.
