WILL IT HAPPEN AGAIN - 4TH-6TH GRADE CAMP?

- Mom & Dad could be counselors at the same camp
- Families liked it for planning vacations with family members at the same camp
- There were still breakout boy and girl activities
- Worship times were more invigorated
- Transportation for churches was much easier

DISTRICT PASTORS ENJOY TRINITY PINES: In September, Trinity Pines hosted the pastors, associates, and spouses from the Intermountain District at the annual event coordinated by District Superintendent, Scott Shaw, and Assistant Superintendent, Dr. Brent Deakins. Over 80 attended and met, prayed, fellowshipped, and worshipped throughout the two and half days. For many, it was their first time visiting the camp. Executive Director Rick Waitley addressed the group one morning reminding them of their opportunity as local pastors to use the camp under certain conditions for personal renewal at no cost to the pastor. We hope pastors will see this as a wonderful getaway experience.

FARMHOUSE REMODEL ON PAUSE: The planning committee working on the remodel and expansion of the farmhouse has put the project on pause until spring of 2024. The challenge has been getting subcontractors for foundation work and preparation for the expansion. While this is disappointing, we have also had several hoops to work through with the City of Cascade on building permits. Thanks to those who have laid the groundwork for the project. We will be looking for work crews in the spring.

RESTROOM UPDATE: We are nearing the \$100,000 mark in funds received for the new restroom facility to be built near the lodges. The goal is to raise \$600,000, of which we hope to secure at least half in a grant from the Murdock Foundation. More will be shared about the project at Share the Dream on November 30. Thanks to those who helped reach this milestone in fundraising. This will meet a major need in that housing area of the camp and will service activities in the center of camp near the worship tent, amphitheater, and athletic fields.

PAVERS: We are approaching the time of the year when it is difficult to install pavers. If you have been waiting to place an order for an engraved paver at the west entrance of the Conference Center (\$250), please do so now and we can install it before winter.

STILL LOOKING: We are still searching for a Maintenance/Facility Director at Trinity Pines. If you know individuals that have skills in this area and would be open to relocating to Cascade, please contact John Theien, Administrator, at john@tpines.org or call 208-382-6200.

THANKS TO VOLUNTEERS: Many hands make light work, and we appreciate those who showed up to work on the new roof for Pomerelle at the end of September. This makes three of the five cottages that have new metal roofs. This is a replacement project the board has undertaken to replace one roof per year aiding the longevity of the facilities.

SPECIAL TASK FORCE: A special task force has been asked to walk through all of our guest areas and give an evaluation of the condition of flooring, walls, beds, fixtures and furnishings. This is never an easy task, and it always results in lots of opinions. While we can't do everything, we acknowledge that some areas are going on 23 years of continuous use and it eventually takes a toll on the conditions. We want our guests to have a positive experience. Look for some changes ahead.
