ONLINE REGISTRATION IS OPEN

Trinity Pines has invested in new software for camper registration. The new program will provide additional information that is important for the health and safety of campers. The decision was made by the Camps Board that **only online registration** would be made available for the 2020 summer camp season. In the next couple weeks, a hard copy of the summer camp brochure will be in churches across the Intermountain District - minus the registration form. However, if you do not have access to a computer or need assistance in registering a camper, you can call the Camp office in Cascade at 208-382-6200 and they will assist you with the registration process. You will find the summer camp brochure contains the same information that it has in the past - what to bring to camp, themes for each of the District-sponsored camps, and names of the directors, plus general health and activity information for the camps by grade levels. Campers are encouraged to register for the camp for the grade they will enter in the fall of 2020. We look forward to adding your name to our registration list for 2020. Payment for summer camps can be made online, and remember the Early Bird Deadline is April 15 in order to receive a discounted cost for summer camp.

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT SUMMER CAMPS

- **Q**: Do you have to be Nazarene to attend a summer camp?
- A: No, we average around 25% from churches other than Nazarene or list no church affiliation at all.
- **Q**: Will campers be exposed to Nazarene theology?
- **A:** Campers will receive Christian education as part of their camp experience through chapel services, devotionals, and sharing times. However, camp is not viewed as a "recruitment opportunity" to make all campers Nazarene. We respect other beliefs and philosophies of campers.
- **Q:** Will campers be safe and cared for?
- A: We maintain a medical staff from NNU Nursing Department. Our kitchen has been certified by Central District Health and our kitchen management team has been certified in specific areas such as allergies, dietetics, and safe food handling. The camp staff is trained in first aid and as well other lifesaving and medical procedures. The lifeguard is certified for open water swimming.
- **Q:** What is the policy on adults at Genesis Camp?
- A: We want an adult (18+) with every 1st or 2nd grader attending camp. 3rd graders do not have to have a parent or guardian with them. Adults can even be a male for Genesis Girls Camp or female for Genesis Boys Camp special lodging will be provided. We believe this is a great experience for the camper and for the adult at Genesis Camp. Each adult MUST complete a background check form in advance of the camp.

WORK WEEK: It is not too early to get Work Week 2020 on your calendar - May 20-25. The plan is to put up the worship tent on Friday morning, May 22, at around 10:00am. However, a wide variety of work projects will happen each day. The camp will provide the lodging and meals for all active volunteers.

5TH GRADERS HAVE AN OPTION: We encourage campers to attend the camp for the grade they will be in the fall following summer camps. In the past, 5th graders have attended 4th-6th Boys' or Girls' Camps. However, we now have some school districts that are placing 6th graders in Middle School. Therefore, this summer we will allow incoming 6th graders to attend either Middle School Camp or 4th-6th Girls' or Boys' Camp (or they can attend both if they desire). The bus will originate from The Village in Meridian on Monday mornings and will return on Friday afternoons.

GOLF CARTS: I doubt we will ever have enough golf carts at camp. We are always watching to see if good gas powered golf carts become available. If you hear of an opportunity please let us know.

CCCA: Often times in our circles at camp, we talk about an organization called CCCA. This stands for Christian Camp and Conference Association which Trinity Pines has been a member of for many years. The organization is based out of Colorado Springs. Members of the Camps Board and some management team members receive periodic mailings from CCCA. Each December, they hold a national meeting and discuss subjects important to Christian camping. In addition, regional events are held. Anthony Henry has a leadership role in the Northwest Region. We often take staff members to regional events to equip them with information and skills to be shared with other employees and volunteers. Our annual dues to the organization are over \$1,500 based upon our total revenue. Of course that has continued to change over the years as Trinity Pines has been blessed by more rental groups as facilities and activities have changed. CCCA serves a vital role. They are our "free legal advice" on several issues and have helped us with policy, facilities, and standards for camping ministry. I am always amazed at how quickly they respond to issues that will impact camps. For instance, this week as the world was dealing with Coronavirus, CCCA did a webinar and immediate information distribution to all members about their recommendations for prevention and dealing with the issue. They have been there on several issues for us over the years and Trinity Pines believe that the investment in CCCA is a good return on the dollar.
