# HERE WE GO AGAIN

We first camped at Trinity Pines in 2001. From those humble beginnings of just the Conference Center and some surplus Army tents for housing, we have never stopped building and expanding. And so, "Here We Go Again."

Elk Valley is the center of Trinity Pines in many ways. Here is where you will find Jubilation Station, the worship tent, the amphitheater trailhead, three lodges, and seven bunkhouses. Elk Valley spills off the mountain into the meadow right where the open play fields for recreation happen throughout the year. Let's just say that Elk Valley is the host of many people-related activities. However, with all of that use, there has always been a shortage of restrooms. Each of the lodges have a restroom facility with sinks, toilets, and showers, but those lodges are frequently used as accommodations for guests and so there is limited access for those participating in other activities in Elk Valley. Hence the Trinity Pines Board, hand-in-hand with the Trinity Pines Property/Development Committee, has launched a campaign to build a new restroom facility in Elk Valley. The building will be two stories with the second level being two apartments for volunteers or summer staff housing. We learned a long time ago that there is cost savings when you go up and not out in construction. We have also come to realize that many individuals and couples who are willing to volunteer do not have access to or own an RV, limiting their ability to volunteer at the camp.

We have recently received some financial gifts for the projects and have a goal of reaching around \$150,000 so we can approach the Murdock Foundation for a matching grant. Murdock likes Trinity Pines and we have been blessed by their support in the past.

Phase I of the project has already started with the remodel of the bunkhouses. In a normal year, we would be making plans to have materials delivered on site to get started ASAP. However, this year is anything but normal, with almost three feet of snow left around the camp and more as you move up into the valleys where the bunkhouses are located.

We will be sharing more about the projects in Elk Valley, but we just wanted you to be prepared for "Here We Go Again!"
