In the spring, when we launched the campaign for Elk Valley to refurbish the seven bunkhouses and build a new restroom/staff housing facility, we were excited with the opportunity to bring improved housing to our guests. The goal was to raise \$8,000 per bunkhouse for the insulation, wallboard, flooring, HVAC and improvements to extend the seasonal usability of the bunkhouses. We called this Phase I. The spring weather was not cooperating, and snow would not melt which pushed back the opportunity to have the bunkhouses ready for use in the summer of 2023. However, all of a sudden the snow melted, the materials dropped in price and became available and the funds were raised to complete Phase I. At District Assembly in early May we had decided that we might be able to have the bunkhouse remodels done prior to August 1 using volunteer help. Then God stepped into the hearts of people and their skills and motivation.

In the days leading up to Work Week at the end of May, we had crews of folks that were on site transforming the bunkhouses. On Saturday, June 3, the Camp Board toured the bunkhouses and acknowledged that all seven were completed and ready for use for the June camps. We still have the mini-splits (HVAC) to be installed but those are not critical until temperatures dictate. There was great news there also, because they were backordered related to some supply chain issues, and they have now all arrived and will be installed over the next couple of weeks. What a miracle in the eyes of man, but on task for when God intervenes. Thanks to those who rallied work crews and those who came and spent many hours helping complete this project. You were like an army of ants working at times on all seven bunkhouses to not trip over each other in the various stages of the projects.

There is also good news on the restroom side of Phase II. Recent memorial gifts and financial support have resulted in over \$84,000 raised for the project. Our goal is to have \$300,000 in the bank before we approach the Murdock Foundation for the remaining funds for the project. Orange stakes and ribbon have been placed in Elk Valley where the facility will be constructed.

Sometimes we are slow learners when it comes to God's plan. While we think this will take a few months to generate the base of \$300,000, we better be prepared... because with God, there are no surprises!
