GREAT RETURN IN CAMPERS

The Lord has blessed us with a great return in campers for the summer. In 2021 (a rebound year with no camps in 2020) the Intermountain District had a total of 839 campers. Following the July 1 deadline for registration this year, we are at 1,025. That is an increase of 186 campers. I was listening to a talk radio program the other day and the commentator identified some of the challenges being faced in America: **single parent homes**, **no father figure present** in many homes, **no example of a marriage relationship**, **country getting further and further away from God**, **breakdown of the education system**, and **lack of examples of leaders**. I believe Trinity Pines has offered our campers, no matter the age, answers and examples to many of these ills:

HOME LIFE: Trinity Pines is a secure and safe place for a week. The directors, leaders, volunteers, and staff all demonstrate wholesome mature adults, many in stable marriage relationships. I observed, in a recent visit, volunteers walking about holding hands as they walked across the camp. What a great example of a love between two people. I sat down on the deck of Jubilation Station and visited with two men who were leading recreation at Boy's Camp. I thought as I finished my conversation - what an example of mature, male leadership they both displayed in what we talked about.

GETTING CLOSE TO GOD: You only need to walk by the amphitheater or worship tent to know that campers are moving closer to God. Their singing, the messages they hear, altars with campers and cabin leaders kneeling and praying together make for a tremendous atmosphere of worship. Then if you need further proof, take a stroll through Stake Garden and see the number of stakes that are labeled "2022" and are noted with phrases such as *called into obedience with God, called into ministry, called to be a missionary* or just a desire to deepen their walk with Christ.

EDUCATION/EXAMPLE LEADERS: My heart is always motivated when I see small groups of students sitting with a cabin leader with their Bibles open and they are exchanging ideas and questions. We are blessed by so many volunteers who give up a portion of their summer to invest in one of our camps. This is not unique to just Nazarene Camps; I was at Trinity Pines while the place was packed out with Assembly of God teens and then children. You could sense the spirit in the leaders that was transferred to campers and elevated in each service as they sang and praised God together.

Yes, the world has its challenges. But for one week, over 1,000 students stepped into a world of peace, security, safety, encouragement, love, and blessing. Was every camper impacted? Probably not. But there were some that have testified to this. Thank you, parents, grandparents, those who provided financial assistance, Sunday school teachers, pastors, and churches who encouraged children and teens to attend camp. Thank you for helping us make a difference.
